have lost two Belgian eateries, both with excellent beer selections. Belgo, the New York edition of a London chain, closed along with Waterloo, a trendy West Village bistro. On a more positive, if modest note, we hail the arrival of **Vol de Nuit** (from the novel by French aviator and writer Antoine de Saint Exupéry, it means *Night Flight* and is also the name of a perfume by Guerlain.) The restaurant is located on West 4th St. East of Sixth Avenue behind the frites place Le Frites Cot. They have six Belgian beers on tap and a lot of mussels. Santé!
